


- Practice only twice a week

The league provided the safety resources (sanitizer, thermometers, safety plan) needed to safely practice during the Fall season.


Answered: 111 Skipped: 0





The volunteers (Managers and Coaches) that facilitated practices did a good job of following the league safety protocol.


Answered: 110 Skipped: 1





At no time did I feel my players safety was compromised during the Fall season.


Answered: 111 Skipped: 0





I would feel comfortable allowing my player(s) to play in the Spring following the same league protocol as the Fall.



Current State Guidelines

The following apply to all of California and all youth sports

- Youth sports may only practice with a group of no more than 14 "cohorts" (players)
- This means teams cannot scrimmage each other
- This means no games
- The state has not given any guidance as to when youth teams can have activities outside their cohorts
- Important RPLL is and will continue to follow all state guidance



Plan to Move Forward with Spring Season

- Practice only until (if) games are approved
 - Best way to get our kids back on the field and being active again
- Expecting season to follow standard timeframe
 - Tryouts for Minor B and above in January
 - Teams formed and practice begins in February
 - Opening Day first weekend of March
 - Up to two practices per week one weekday, one Saturday
 - RPLL is flexible and this may change



RPLL Goals for Spring Season

- Provide a safe, fun environment for kids to enjoy the game, get exercise, and socialize
 - May not include games
- There are a lot of new rules and procedures in the name of safety
 - Asking our players, volunteers and spectators to do the best they can following the new guidance
- Provide transparency and open communication related to safety before and during the Spring season



RPLL Costs for Spring Season

- RPLL is 100% run by volunteers
- Costs for the Spring not including game play includes:
 - Field permits and other City of San Diego fees
 - Lights
 - Field prep
 - Uniforms
 - League Charter
 - Insurance
 - Volunteer background checks
 - More!
- Costs if games are played include:
 - Umpires
 - Game day field prep
 - TOC tournament dues



Background on Document Creation

- Stephen, with input from the RPLL Board, created a return to play safety plan for RPLL and shared with District 32 during the summer
 - Researched reopening by other leagues and youth sports across the country
 - Ensure adherence with CDC, State and County guidelines
 - Consulted with local ER Doctor
- This document became the baseline for the District 32 plan
 - Stephen part of a District committee who developed the District's plan which was then approved by League Presidents



Background on Document Creation

- District 32 plan at this time is specific to the Juniors division
 - Since this is many of the Juniors players last year of Little League, Juniors were practicing and hoping to play games when authorized by the County
 - Revised District plan will be created before Fall Ball games begin
- District plan ensures consistency with how member league's are safely reopening
 - Important for interleague games
- The District plan will be updated before any games are authorized



District 32 Safety Plan - Covid-19

- No spitting
- Games will be scheduled with extra time between games to reduce crowds
- Player drop off before games no earlier than 40 minutes before game time
- No sharing of equipment
 - o Bats, helmets, gloves
 - Players bags with their equipment will be kept under their seat
- All volunteers that are on the field will wear a face covering/mask at all times
- All players will wear a face covering/mask if dugouts are used
 - Optional when they are playing defense/offense this is solely determined by the players guardian



District 32 Safety Plan - Covid-19

- Players will depart the field area within 5 minutes of their game ending
 - No team cheers, huddles or snacks
- No handshakes or personal contact celebrations allowed
- The Pledge of Allegiance and Little League Pledge will be recited with players reciting both from their spot in the dugout
- Catcher's masks will not be shared during a game
- Defensive team will have their own set of game balls each game
- In addition to the manager and coaches, one team Safety Parent will be allowed in the dugout area to assist with safety protocols
- The home plate umpire will be located behind the pitcher's mound



District 32 Safety Plan - Covid-19 - Practices

- Players will be submitted to a health screening upon arrival
 - RPLL using touchless thermometers
- Hand sanitizer breaks at least every 30 minutes
 - Players are asked to bring their own, but RPLL will provide as needed
- Dugouts will not be used
 - Player bags will be placed down the lines, 6 feet apart
- No sharing of equipment to include bats, helmets and gloves
- Teams will sanitize all shared items after their practice if another team will be using the field afterwards
 - Shared items include: pitching machines, gates, portable screens, etc.



RPLL Local Rules - Covid-19

- No players playing the position of catcher below AA
- Players can use league-provided catchers gear, but it must be returned after each game for sanitizing
 - No sharing of catcher's masks in game
- We may not use the dugouts for games if approved
 - Each player needs to bring their own chair for every game
 - The team's manager will place the chair outside the dugout upon player arrival which will be the players dugout location for that game
- The area behind the dugouts and backstop will be taped off so that only players and on field volunteers are permitted
 - Spectator seating map will be provided before games begin

RPLL Local Rules - Covid-19

The Rancho Penasquitos Little League Executive Board will review repeat violators or blatant violations of the rules contained in this and the District document by players, volunteers or spectators on a case by case basis. Consequences can include suspension.
